Call for Consultancy Data for Advocacy (D4A) workshop facilitator Girls' Education in Emergencies in Kenya

Project Background

Equal Measures 2030, and its partner FAWE, are collaborating on the Global Affairs Canada-funded project "Data-Driven Advocacy for Girls Education in Emergencies (EiE) in Africa." The project aims to work with both women's rights organizations (WROs) and decision-makers to improve the collection and use of gender data to advance education for girls' and women in fragile settings within Kenya. The project is part of the Global Affairs Canada commitment to The Charlevoix declaration, which aims to improve education for girls and women affected by crises, as well as lead to the collection of better sex and age disaggregated data on education in emergencies.

Scope of Work

EM2030 and FAWE is seeking a consultant to facilitate the data-for-advocacy (D4A) workshop using the EM2030's existing D4A curriculum and facilitators guide. The workshop will aim at building capacities of representatives from Women Rights Organizations in collecting and using data to advocate for reforms in girl's education in Kenya. The work is expected to commence in March for a period of Five days.

Key Deliverables

Working closely with FAWE and EM2030, the consultant will:

- Review 'data for advocacy' training materials and adapt the D4A curriculum to the needs of the local context
- Review the research findings from the data mapping and baseline needs assessment survey that was undertaken to inform development of the workshop
- Develop and organize professional presentations of all workshop materials, presentations, and activities
- Create a productive, detailed agenda for the workshop and working sessions.
- Host an EM2030 and FAWE staff - only discussion before the workshop to reflect, amend plans where needed, and refine concepts
- Design and/or produce new content for any additional modules/resources, drawing on relevant local context where necessary
- Review participant feedback at the end of each day and incorporate suggestions into their delivery and content for the following day
- Conduct a post-workshop survey and analyze results
- Prepare a Post-workshop report and deliver to FAWE within one week after the workshop

Required technical expertise, skills and knowledge

- Demonstrated experience of developing training materials and strong copywriting/editing skills
- Proven experience facilitating workshops and/or group trainings and the ability to ensure all voices are heard, while guiding the conversation towards concrete ideas
- Previous experience of capacity-building civil society groups and/or knowledge of national level advocacy tools and techniques preferable

- Experience in communicating technical themes, particularly in relation to data, to non-technical experts
- Proven experience developing and designing communications campaigns
- Knowledge of Education in emergencies for girls and women
- Experience working with Women Rights organizations and movements
- A collaborative and supportive facilitation style
- Strong interpersonal skills and experience working across with partners in multiple contexts
- Excellent cross-cultural communication and interpersonal skills, as well as an ability to work independently
- High attention to detail, a focus on solutions, and an optimistic outlook

Desirable

- Masters or PhD degree in education, comparative and international education, education in emergencies, or related social sciences, international affairs, and international development.
- Up to date knowledge of a wide range of data sources related to gender and education in fragile and conflict-affected areas of Kenya
- Demonstrated understanding of use of data for advocacy to counter the existing barriers to quality education for girls and women in emergency contexts in Kenya

Budget, timelines and ways of working

- The workshop will be held in Nairobi
- The Scope of work is estimated to take about 10 days, but consultants are required to provide details for their proposed timing and costings in the cover letter
